His treatment of Rosalind Franklin, by calumny and by theft of her work (use without acknowledgement in that original Nature article), is appalling. but also rather typical of the time, as women were very unwelcome in science except as lab assistants. (women still not very welcome a quarter century later). Franklin was conveniently dead at the time the Nobel for DNA model was awarded, otherwise the judges would (should) have had to recognize that her role was greater than that of Wilson and she would have been third in the trio of recipients.
